

There is a marginal risk (category 1 out of 5) for severe thunderstorms today. Hail up to half dollars and 70 mph winds are possible along with heavy rain.



Temperatures will be not quite as hot today as upper level pressure shifts slightly to the northwest. Look for highs most in the middle to upper 90s on the Caprock and near 100 degrees to the east. A few thunderstorms will be possible late in the day and into the evening.

This Morning's Rain Chances




Showers and storms will continue ahead of a slow moving cold front this morning. The line of storms will gradually work its way southward. Although the severe weather threat is low, a few gusty winds and minor flooding will be possible.




Another hot day is in store across North and Central Texas. The hottest temperatures will be across Central Texas, where heat index values will range between 105-108 degrees. A heat advisory is in effect through 8 PM today. A few storms are expected to develop this afternoon across Central Texas, some of which may be strong. Gusty downburst winds and lightning will be the main threats.



A Heat Advisory remains in effect for today from 10 AM to 8 PM.





A heat advisory is in effect from 1 PM this afternoon until 7 pm this evening. Heat index values up to 110 degrees are expected for portions of the Victoria Crossroads and the Coastal Bend. Drink plenty of fluids, stay in an air-conditioned room, stay out of the sun, and check up on relatives and neighbors.



A Heat Advisory is in effect for areas along and east of most of the Interstate 35 corridor into the Coastal Plains. Heat index values in this area will be around 108-110 degrees this afternoon.






