




A Heat Advisory is in effect today for areas off the Caprock from 1 PM to 7 PM CDT with high temperatures ranging from 105 to 109 degrees.

With temperatures climbing above the 105 mark in many areas, a Heat Advisory is in effect. Be alert for heat related illness.



Dangerous Heat is expected region-wide today, with widespread highs around 100 to 105 degrees forecast this afternoon, and up to around 110+ across the northeastern Permian Basin and along the Rio Grande in the Big Bend. An Excessive Heat Warning is in effect for the northeastern Permian Basin, and a Heat Advisory is in effect for most of the remainder of the area. Now is the time to act! Drink plenty of water, even if you don't feel thirsty, and never leave kids or pets in a hot car look before you lock! Remember, prolonged exposure could result in heat-related illness.


