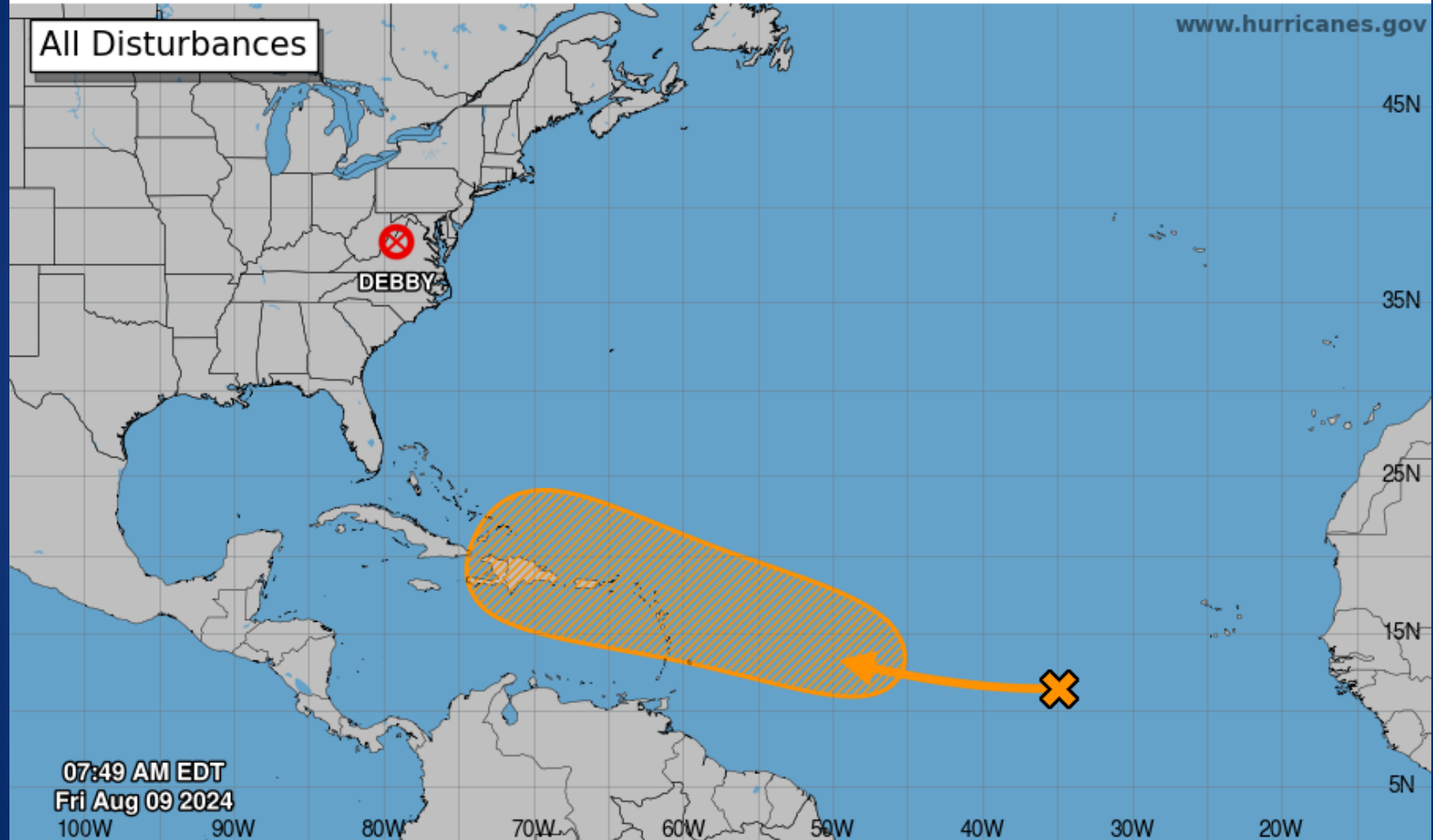


Seven-Day Graphical Tropical Weather Outlook

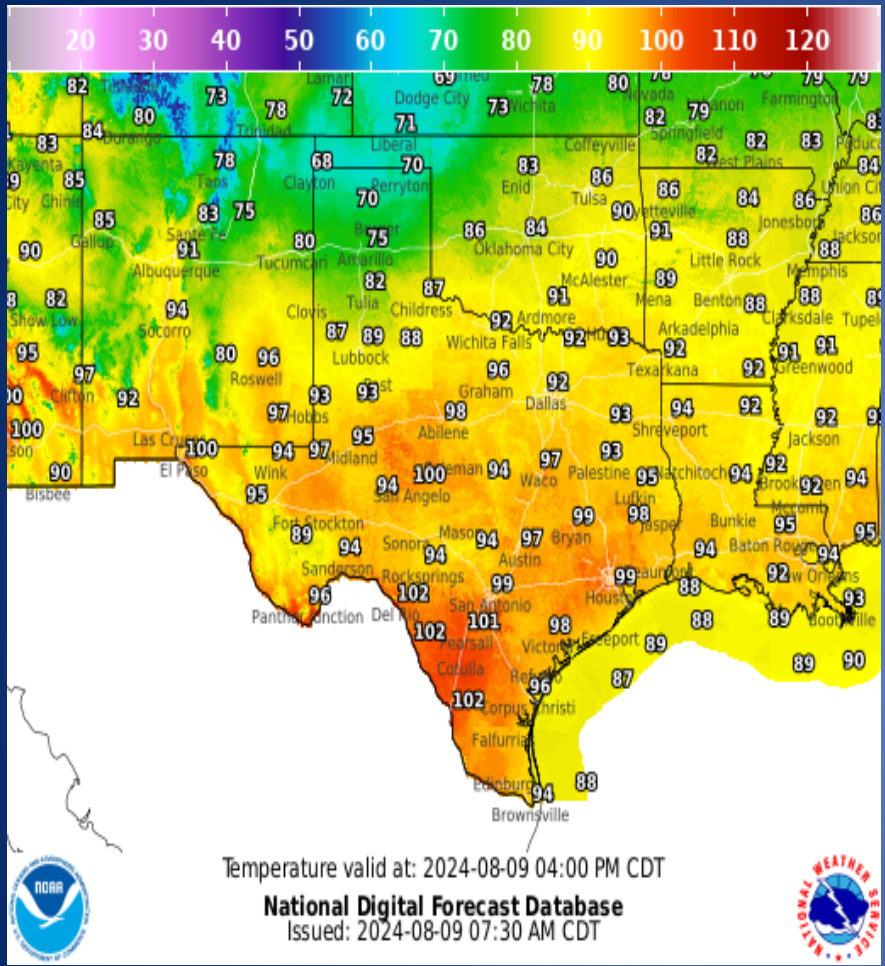

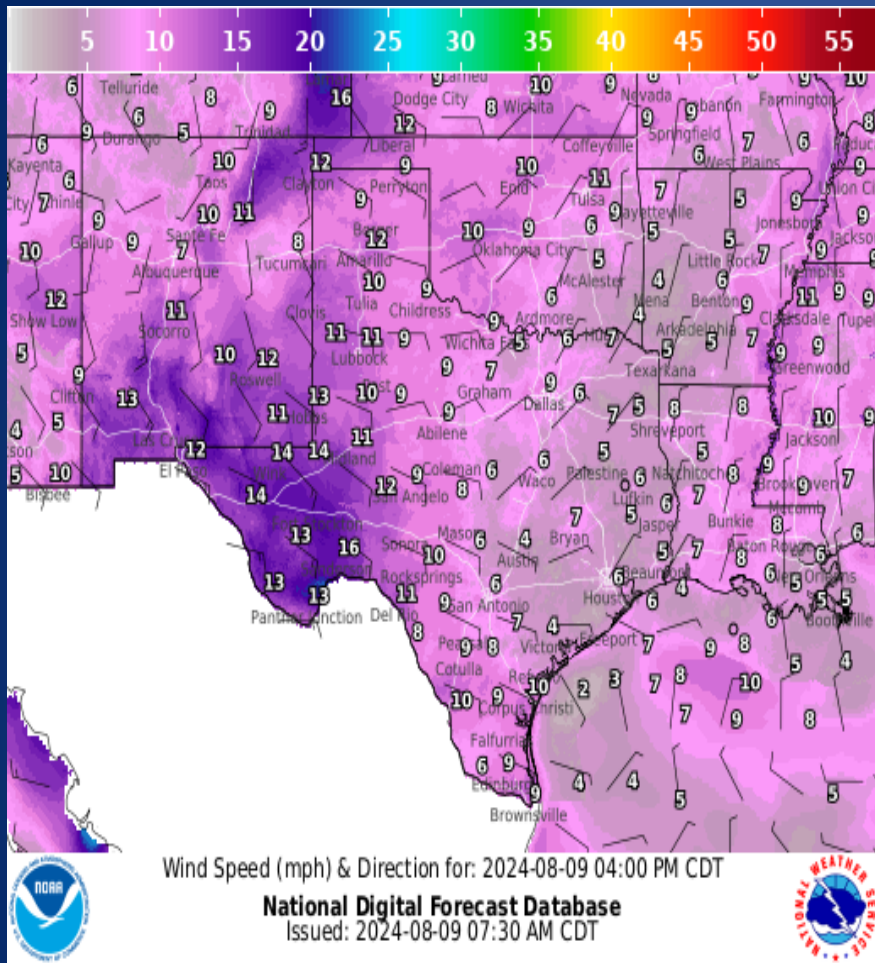

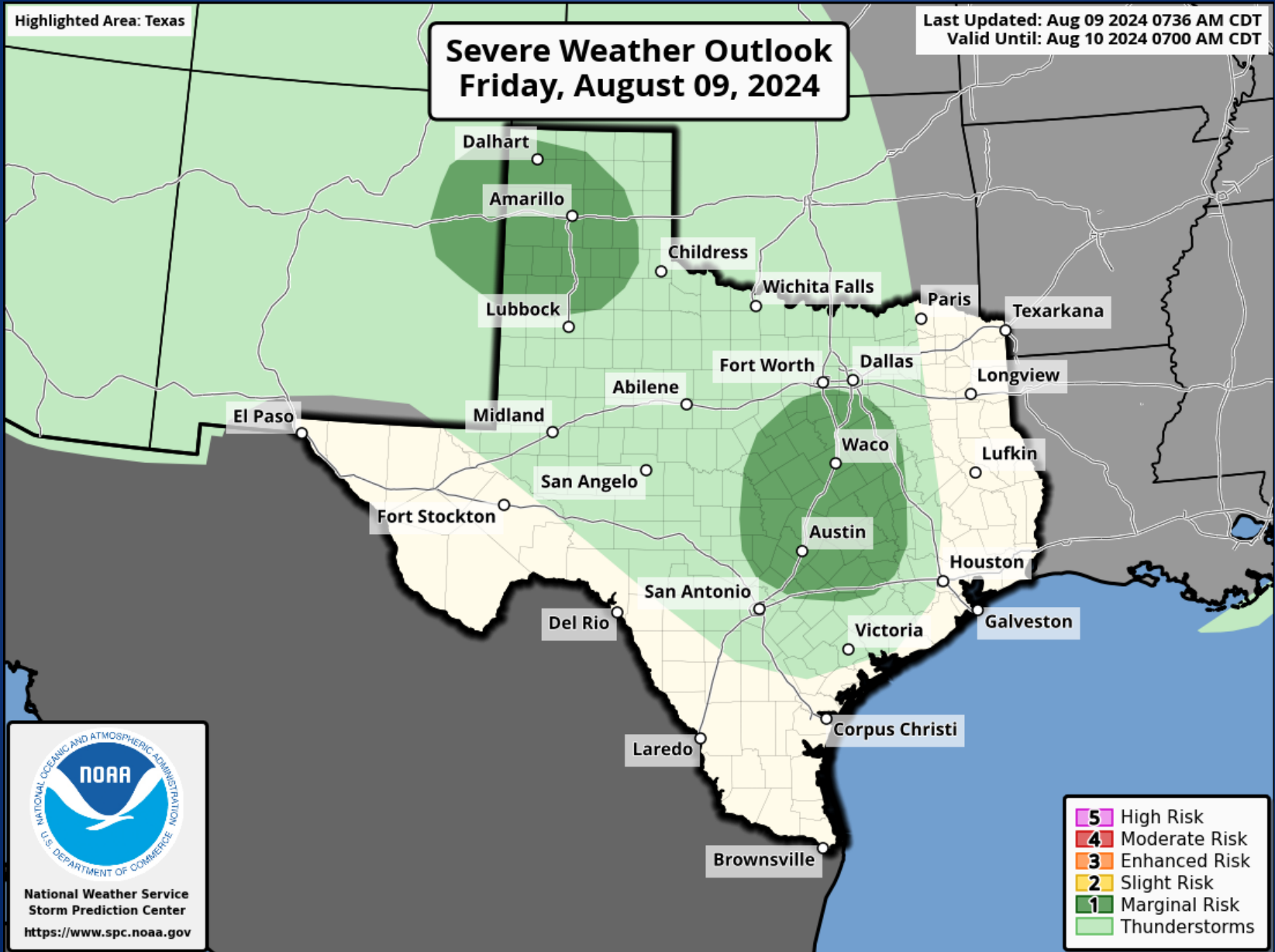

Some locations may pick up 1-2 inches or more of rainfall quickly.

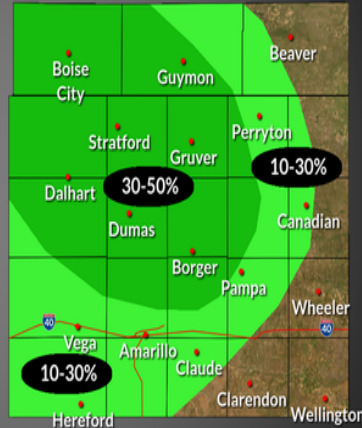

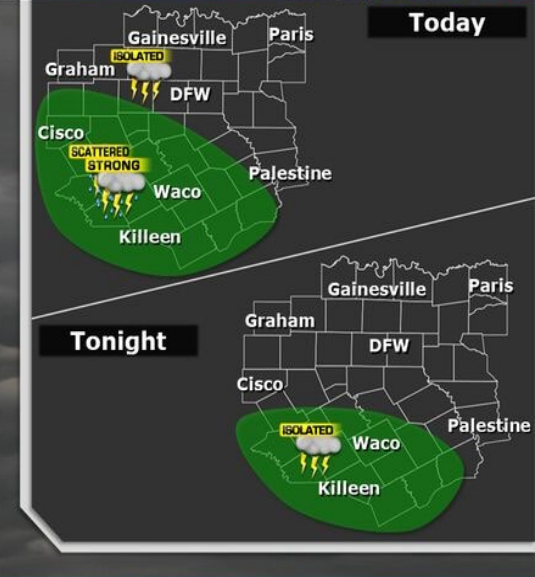
Increasing storm chances ahead and along a weak cold front will take us through the afternoon and evening.

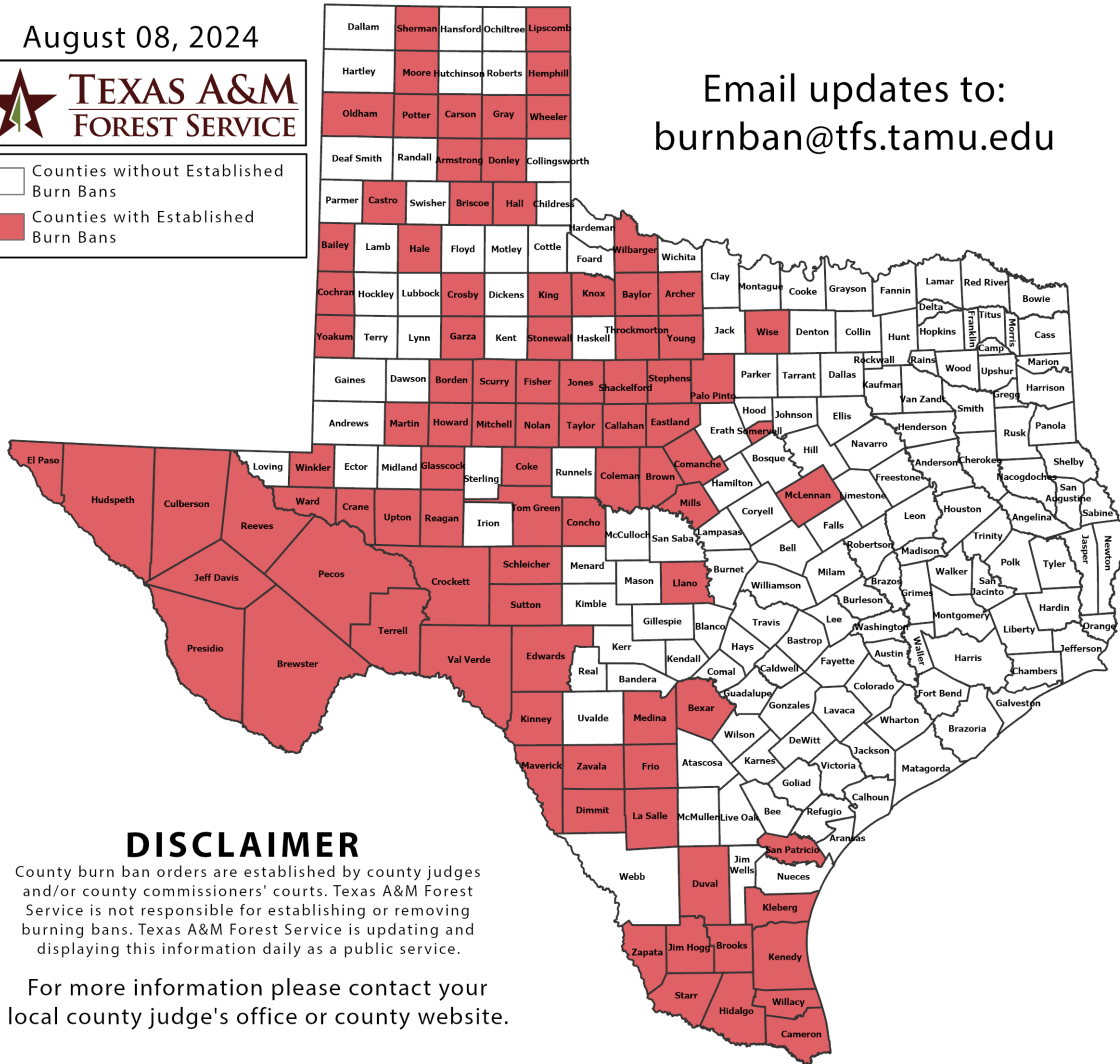

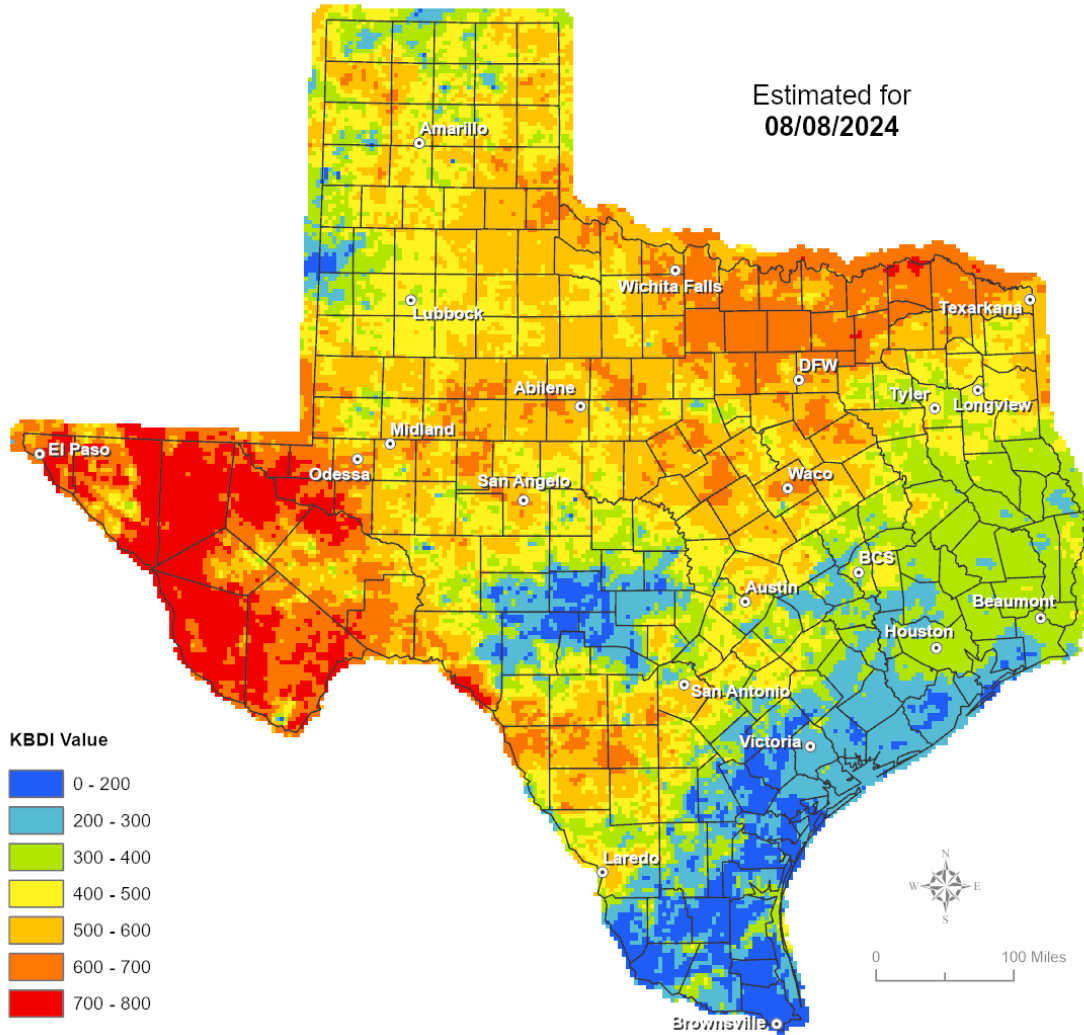

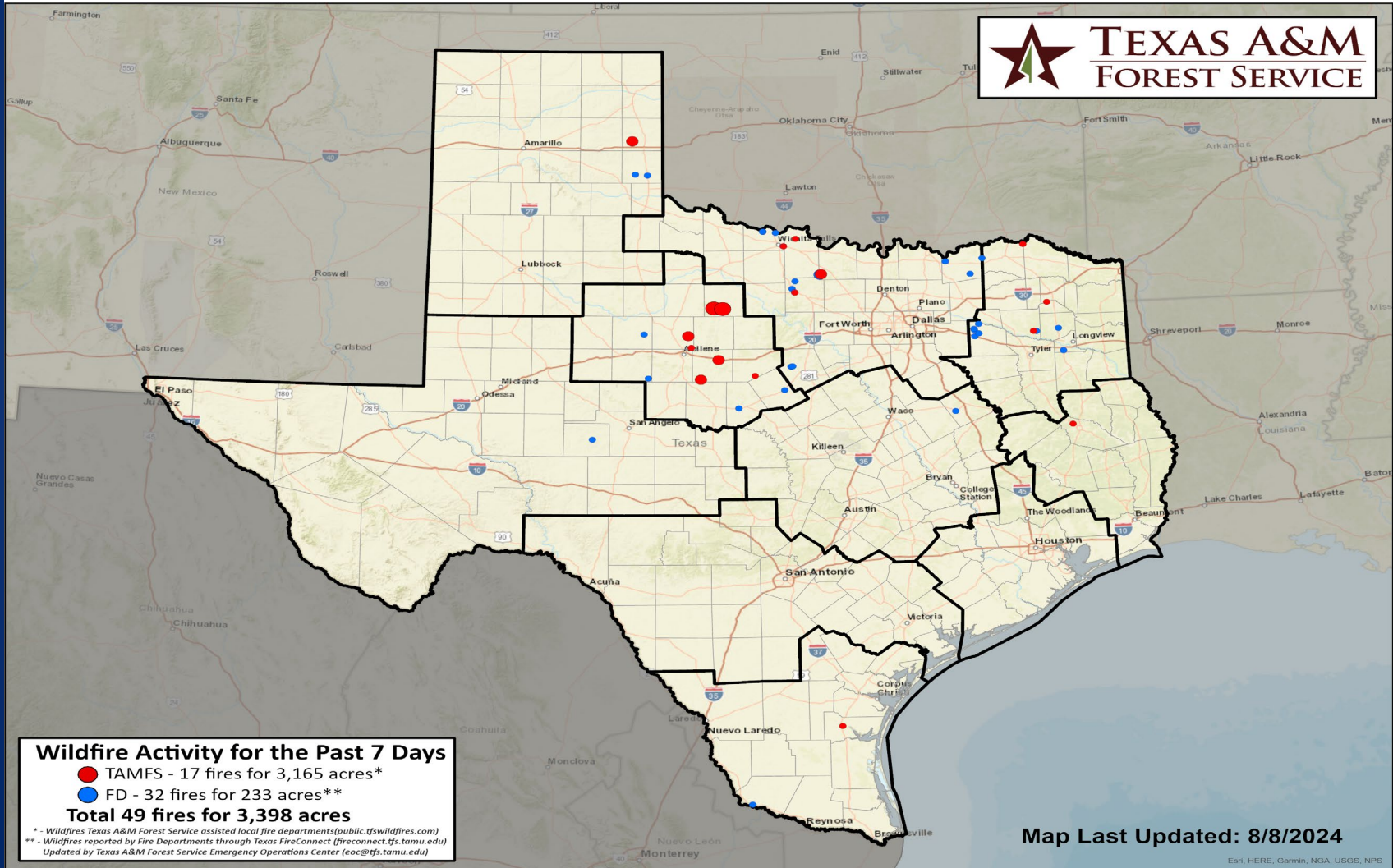
