


There are low end chances for some isolated to scattered showers and storms late this afternoon through the evening hours. Storms are not expected to be severe, but they still could have lightning and moderate to heavy rainfall.




Isolated thunderstorms will be possible across portions of the extreme southern Texas Panhandle and the northern South Plains this evening. Brief downpours and gusty winds will accompany storms that move into these areas, and the severe weather threat is low. It will be dry elsewhere and hot at sunset. Temperatures shown are the graphic are valid for 7 PM CDT this evening.

#### **Hazardous Weather**




There is a low chance that another morning complex of storms approaches the Red River through the morning. As morning clouds clear, things will begin to heat up with highs climbing into the mid 90s to lower 100s. Additional thunderstorms may linger across the Red River into the early afternoon hours as well.



# Fire Danger Forecast




