







The threat for severe thunderstorms is focused in the northwest Panhandles this afternoon and evening. Robust storms, and perhaps a few supercells, will be capable of producing large hail and damaging winds.




Highs today will range in the lower 90's to mid 100's. The hottest temperatures are mostly likely for the southeastern Texas Panhandle today, and the Palo Duro Canyon could reach up to 105 degrees. A Heat Advisory has been issued for the canyon due to these high temperatures. Continue to practice heat safety during the peak heating hours of the afternoon.







Hot conditions will prevail for Monday. The highs will be in the mid to upper 90s inland with heat indices up to 111 degrees F. A few thunderstorms could develop near and along the sea breeze in the afternoon.



A Heat Advisory has been issued for Hidalgo, Brooks and inland and coastal Willacy, Cameron, and Kenedy Counties from Noon to 5 PM this afternoon. The combination of high temperatures and humidity will push the heat indices as high as 114 degrees. Drink plenty of fluids, stay in an airconditioned room, Check the backseat, limit exposure time in the sun, and check up on relatives, neighbors, workers, and the elderly.




A Heat Advisory is in effect through 7 PM today. Heat index values up to 112 are expected. A few spots across the Coastal Plains and Victoria Crossroads may briefly reach 110 this afternoon. Please use caution if you must be outside: drink plenty of water, take breaks, and wear light colored, loose clothing.




Hot and humid today with temps climbing into the low 90s to around 103. A Heat Advisory is in effect along the Coastal Bend with heat index values up to 112 this afternoon. There is a low to medium chance for showers and thunderstorms today, mainly over portions of the Coastal Bend and Victoria Crossroads.

Fire Danger Forecast




Burn Ban




