







Isolated thunderstorms may bring brief heavy rain and gusty winds mainly across the southern Texas Panhandle.



Widespread triple digit heat will continue today across the forecast area with light southerly winds. A Heat Advisory is in effect issued for areas along and east of the Caprock Escarpment from noon to 8 PM CDT with high temperatures of 105 to 109 degrees expected.




Some additional isolated thunderstorms are expected to develop this afternoon and evening over the southern Texas Panhandle and northern portions of the South Plains and Rolling Plains. A few strong wind gusts are possible, but the chance of rain is generally less than 20 percent.




An Excessive Heat Warning is in effect until Sunday evening for portions of north Texas. Heat index values in the warned (pink) area are expected to exceed 110 degrees this weekend. A Heat Advisory remains in effect for the remainder of the area through Sunday evening. Ensure you're practicing heat safety by drinking plenty of water, taking frequent breaks indoors in the A/C, and wearing light- colored, lightweight clothing.


Fire Danger Forecast

Keetch-Byram Drought Index


