






With active weather on the rise for today, so too have our chances for severe. At this time, expect for best chances to be the in the northwest with the storms moving off the Southern Rockies. Main threat with any storm that does become severe will be winds with gust up to 70 mph possible. However, hail up to an inch in size can't be fully ruled out either.





With the present frontal boundary expected to stall out over the Panhandles today, active weather has become more likely this afternoon and evening. Best chances will be seen in the Nonwestern and Southeastern corners with a low chance of see an isolated severe storm out of the west. Meanwhile, temperatures do cool slightly for the north, but still expect triple digit temperatures to be possible in the southern Panhandles.




Sunny and very hot conditions are on repeat today. Very muggy air this morning in the far southeast Texas Panhandle will dry out by the afternoon. Highs will range from around 100 on the Caprock to 104 to 109 degrees elsewhere.

An Excessive Heat Warning is in effect until Tuesday evening for western portions of North and Central Texas. A Heat Advisory is in effect for areas between Bowie and Palestine Monday evening. Afternoon highs up to 110 degrees and heat index values up to 113 degrees will significantly increase the potential for heat related illnesses through the early evening. Ensure you're practicing heat safety by drinking plenty of water, taking frequent breaks indoors in the A/C, and wearing light-colored, lightweight clothing.






A Heat Advisory is in effect through 8 PM today. Heat index values 110 to 114 are expected. Please use caution if you must be outside: drink plenty of water, take breaks, and wear light colored, loose clothing.



An Excessive Heat Warning has been issued from 1 PM Tuesday to 9 PM Wednesday for the eastern Hill Country, I-35 Corridor and Coastal Prairies. The rest of South Central Texas is under a Heat Advisory for this same period. A Heat Advisory remains in effect through 8 PM this evening for central and eastern portions of South Central Texas.





Fire Danger Forecast



Keetch-Byram Drought Index


