




A Heat Advisory is in effect today from 1 PM to 8 PM CDT for the south-central Texas Panhandle and eastern South Plains where temperatures up to 107 can be expected. An excessive heat warning is in effect for the southeastern Texas Panhandle and Rolling Plains for temperatures up to 112 degrees.




An Excessive Heat Warning is in effect until Thursday evening for western portions of North and Central Texas. A Heat Advisory is in effect for most other areas. Afternoon highs up to 108 degrees and heat index values up to 112 degrees will significantly increase the potential for heat related illnesses through the early evening. Ensure you're practicing heat safety by drinking plenty of water, taking frequent breaks indoors in the A/C, and wearing light-colored, lightweight clothing.




**Excessive Heat Warnings and Heat Advisories continue through Wednesday.** 



The combination of high temperatures and relative humidity will produce dangerous heat conditions for nearly all of Deep South Texas and the Rio Grande Valley. As a result, a Heat Advisory is in effect for the afternoon and early evening hours of Thursday.



A Heat Advisory is in effect across South Texas Today from Noon to 7 PM. There is a major to extreme risk of heat related impacts. Heat indices of 110 to 114 can be expected this afternoon. A few locations may briefly reach 115-117. Stay cool and hydrated. Look before you lock!



An Excessive Heat Warning is now in effect for the eastern Hill Country, I-35 Corridor, and inland portions of the Coastal Plains, while a Heat Advisory remains in effect for the rest of South-Central Texas. These are in effect through 9 PM CDT this evening.

An Excessive Heat Warning and a Heat Advisory are in effect this afternoon and evening.




An Excessive Heat Warning is in effect through early this evening for Mitchell and Scurry Counties. A Heat Advisory is in effect through early Thursday evening for the much of the plains of West Texas and Southeast New Mexico, the mountains, and Big Bend. Temperatures up to 112 degrees are forecast in the warning area, with 106 degrees or more across the plains, and 95 to 100 degrees in the mountains. Now is the time to act! Drink plenty of water, even if you don't feel thirsty. Remember that prolonged exposure to the heat could result in heat-related illness. And NEVER leave children or pets in a car - LOOK BEFORE YOU LOCK!




### Fire Danger Forecast

#### **Keetch-Byram Drought Index**


