






Wind Speeds






Mild temperatures once again with a few isolated thunderstorms across the far southwestern Texas Panhandle.






Here are today's rain chances.




Temperatures will not be as hot today with highs ranging from the mid 90s along the coast to just above 100 west. Isolated showers and storms will be possible east.




Increasing moisture will result in a improved chances for showers and thunderstorms today and tonight. Areas west of the Rio Grande have the highest chance for rain with a more isolated coverage to the east of the River. Thunderstorms will also produce strong outflow winds with blowing dust possible in dust prone areas. It will be a another warm day across the region with above normal temperatures. However, a cooling is expected over the next few days with day time temperatures lowering to near seasonal averages.

Fire Danger Forecast




