







No record highs? Fewer triple digits?? More rain & storm chances??? What a sight for sore eyes! The worst of the heat wave looks to be behind us, as we kick off a gradual cooling trend today. A few spots could still hit 100 this afternoon, but that will be the anomaly rather than the norm. Scattered storms will return to the western and central Panhandles later this afternoon-evening with strong wind gusts and heavy rain possible once again.



Storm chances expand over the west on Monday. Highs will top out in the mid to upper 90s.




Scattered showers and storms are possible on both Monday and Tuesday afternoons, mainly across Central Texas. Highs will be in the mid and upper 90s, but humidity will be slightly higher than previous days. No severe weather is expected.




Scattered showers and storms expected to develop through the day, with the highest rain chances across lower southeast Texas. High temperatures will be a little lower in areas that see a higher coverage of showers and storms, with temps around 90 degrees. Away from convection, high temps will be hot, reaching the middle to upper 90s.




Highs in the low to mid 90s. Isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms expected during the day, mainly south of I-10.



A mid-level low approaching the Victoria Crossroads area will cause a medium to high chance of showers and thunderstorms across South Texas, west to east respectively. High temperatures will be suppressed from the upper 80s to around 100 out west with max heat index values of 100-105°F.



Today will be partly cloudy with isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms. High temperatures will be near normal ranging from the lower 90s to near 100.






Active weather will continue for our area as high pressure moves over the Midwest and an inverted trough moves across the far Southwest. Showers and thunderstorms are expected during the afternoon and evening hours. The main concerns will be heavy rainfall that can lead to flash flooding and strong gusty winds. The skies will be partly to mostly cloudy with the high temperatures in the afternoon near the normal.



Fire Danger Forecast




