


Wind Speeds








There is a low chance (category 1 out of 3) for flash flooding tonight with showers and thunderstorms that develop along a cold front in a moist airmass. While minor flooding is possible, the flash flood threat should be limited to areas that see long durations of thunderstorms or multiple rounds of thunderstorms.




Shower and thunderstorm coverage will be on the increase by late Thursday evening, especially across northern Oklahoma. A few storms with gusty winds will be possible.



Unsettled weather will continue with additional chances for showers and storms today and Friday. Coverage will remain scattered today, so many will miss out on beneficial rainfall. Chances for showers and storms will be slightly higher on Friday, but not all will see rain. Fortunately, temperatures should see a downward trend as we close out the work week with afternoon highs in the mid 80s to mid 90s. Thursday will be a tad cooler with more scattered afternoon storms.



Scattered thunderstorms are forecast to develop across the South Plains this afternoon and last into the night. Isolated, strong to locally severe wind gusts between 50 to 60 mph will be possible in addition to locally heavy rainfall. High temperatures will range from near 90 on the Caprock and into the middle 90s in the Rolling Plains with a southerly wind between 10-15 mph.



Fire Danger Forecast




