




Partly cloudy skies and highs in the mid-80s are expected for much of the area today. Scattered thunderstorms will continue across the southern Rolling Plains.



A weak front will provide focus for isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms Sunday an Monday, mainly in the afternoon and evening. Severe weather is not expected, but a few storms could produce gusty winds, heavy rain, and frequent lightning. Otherwise, high temperatures will be in the 80s to lower 90s.



Sunday will be warm with highs in the 80s to lower 90s. Isolated to scattered showers/storms are expected during the day, mainly in areas along the coast near Galveston Bay.



Near normal temperatures are expected. Low to medium rain chances will remain in the forecast through this afternoon.

Scattered to numerous showers and storms are forecast today across the High local area. temperatures in the mid to upper 80s most locations to mid and upper 90s across the Rio Grande.




A weak low pressure trough aloft along with persistent monsoonal moisture will allow for another round of scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms across the lowlands and west of the Divide. Isolated showers and thunderstorms are expected in the afternoon hours in the Sacramento Mountains, Cloudiness over the area will keep temperatures will be about 2 to 4 degrees below normal across the Borderland.




