
Seven-Day Graphical Tropical Weather Outlook



Overview


- Periods of showers and storms are possible across the area today. Locations along the coast will see the most rainfall.
- Locations south of the I-10 corridor should generally expect to see 1-3" of rainfall through tonight.
- A few isolated heavier downpours may result in a few locations seeing 3-6" of rainfall today. As a result, the WPC has placed parts of the area within a **Slight Risk** of Excessive Rainfall.

Impacts

- The timing window for locally heavy downpours will be between this morning and late this afternoon.
- Some **isolated** street flooding is possible in areas that see the heaviest downpours of the day.
- Localized rises along rivers/streams are possible.

Actions

- Remain weather aware if you have any Labor Day plans.
- Never attempt to cross a flooded roadway - "Turn Around, Don't Drown!"





Scattered to numerous showers and storms are forecast today across the region. Locally heavy rainfall is possible. High below normal temperatures mainly in the 80s to near 90.



What to Expect

Multiple days of rainfall are expected across West Central Texas. Widespread 2 to 3 inches are possible during this time, with localized higher amounts. This could lead to flooding for portions of our area today through Tuesday. A Flood Watch will be in effect for areas along and south of I-20 where previous rainfall may lead to increased runoff and flooding.





Hazardous Weather



Strong low level east flow will bring more moisture into the area. Showers and thunderstorms are expected in the afternoon, with best chances from the Rio Grande Valley east. With the considerable clouds and showers, high temperatures will be well below normal, especially east of the Rio Grande Valley.





Keetch-Byram Drought Index


