Though the brunt of the rain has ended, there will still be occasional chances for showers and storms through Friday associated with moisture wrapping around a disturbance in the northwest Gulf, along with the approach of a cold front. Not everyone will see rain, and no severe weather is expected. Otherwise, seasonably warm weather is expected with highs in the 80s to lower 90s.



Additional isolated to scattered showers and storms are expected on Wednesday.

Disturbance pushes into the region from the north tonight

Orange Area:

- Scattered storms expected from afternoon through much of overnight
- Burn scar flooding possible
- Potential for strong gusts to 50 mph and small hail

Yellow Area:

- Isolated to scattered storms from afternoon into overnight
- Better storm chances over Black Range and Sierra County
- · Gusts to 40 mph possible

White Area:

- · No storms expected
- · Gusts to 40 mph from outflows possible





Fire Danger Forecast




Burn Ban




