
Wind Speeds







A Coastal Flood Advisory is in effect till 7 PM CDT Tuesday evening for the beaches along the Lower Texas Coast as waters are expected to push into the dunes.




High temperatures and rain chances for today.



A Tropical Storm Watch is in effect for Coastal and Island portions of Cameron and Willacy Counties, the Laguna Madre and parts of the Lower Texas Coastal Gulf Waters for the potential of tropical storm- force winds.



A Tropical Storm Watch is in effect through Wednesday morning. Frequent gusts to 35 knots with seas to 11 feet are expected as Potential Tropical Cyclone Six approaches the coastal waters. Tropical Storm force winds are possible from early Tuesday morning until Wednesday morning. Small Craft Advisory conditions will continue across the open waters through Tuesday evening. Elevated NE winds up to 30 knots and seas up to 8 feet are expected. These are dangerous marine conditions; mariners should seek safe harbor!




There is a High risk of rip currents in effect today through Tuesday evening along the beaches of the Middle Texas Coast. Dangerous swimming conditions are expected, especially near piers and jetties. There is also a Coastal Flood Advisory in effect this evening through Tuesday evening as water may reach the dunes.






