





While most of the Panhandles have the potential for severe weather, our main concern will be along the Amarillo to Guymon line, and west. That's not to say that severe weather couldn't occur further east, but the atmosphere is most favored west of that line.



Several rounds of storms are expected today, some storms may be severe, but all storms have the potential for heavy rain rates that could exceed 1" per hour. Given that multiple rounds of storms are expected with these rates, we have a flood watch for the central and western Texas Panhandle. Right now the most favored area for the most rainfall, would be the south central Panhandle. But just about all areas have at least a 10% chance of seeing these high rain rates.



Thunderstorm chances this afternoon will generally favor areas west and northwest of Lubbock. Some of these storms could become severe and produce heavy rain and flooding.



Scattered strong to severe thunderstorms are expected on Sunday afternoon into late evening across portions of western/central Oklahoma and western-north Texas. Damaging winds and large hail are the primary severe hazards.




There is a low to medium risk of severe storms this afternoon and early evening, mainly over Southeast New Mexico. Any severe storms that do develop will be accompanied by damaging winds and/or large hail and/or an isolated tornado.



# Fire Danger Forecast




