
Showers and thunderstorm chances will continue today through the afternoon hours for the Panhandles. The southeastern Texas Panhandle has the higher potential for showers and storms today as a cold front passes through the area.



A cold front tomorrow will bring additional chances for showers and thunderstorms to the area. The best chances will be along and east of the I-27 corridor. A strong to severe storm may be possible during the afternoon hours across the far southeast Texas Panhandle and Rolling Plains with damaging wind gusts up to 60 mph and large hail up to quarter size possible. Additionally, heavy rainfall may lead to flooding concerns.



Despite ongoing drought conditions, heavy rainfall within a short time period and potential storm training could lead to localized flash flooding. Portions of southwestern Oklahoma and westernnorth Texas have the highest odds to see flooding through Sunday evening.




Scattered strong to severe thunderstorms are expected from late Sunday morning into evening. Damaging winds and large hail are the primary severe hazards.

Hot weather will continue today with high temperatures in the mid 90s. A cold front will approach the area late this afternoon with scattered showers and thunderstorms mainly to our northwest. The cold front will move through North Texas tonight with scattered showers developing and continuing through the overnight hours.

Morning low clouds will give way to partly cloudy skies this afternoon. Patchy fog is possible east of Interstate 35 and Coastal Plains through mid morning. High temperatures will be in upper 80s to upper 90s. Slight chance for showers and storms across Val Verde County late afternoon.

Rainfall heavy enough to cause localized flash flooding of streets, creeks, streams, and other low lying areas.







Fire Danger Forecast




