- Slight risk for excessive rainfall leading to flash flooding over northern AR today and Friday.
- Isolated minor river flooding continues in NEAR this week.
- **Tropical Weather Outlook:** 
  - Hurricane Helene is expected to become a major hurricane and make landfall in the Ο Florida Big Bend Region this evening. No impacts to FEMA 6.
  - **TS** Isaac formed over northern central Atlantic. No impacts to FEMA 6. Ο
  - High chance (80%) for tropical development in the eastern Atlantic over the next 7 days. Ο No impacts to FEMA 6.







### Slight risk of heavy rainfall across **NEAR**




### Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities




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### Slight risk of heavy rainfall over E/NE AR




