- Periods of moderate to locally heavy rain through Saturday may lead to isolated flash flooding along the Gulf Coast, mainly over the TX Coastal Bend.
- **Tropical Weather Outlook:**
 - **Disorganized showers and thunderstorms over portions of the Gulf of Mexico are** associated with a surface trough. A broad area of low pressure is expected to form over the south-central Gulf of Mexico this weekend. A tropical system could develop early next if the low remains separate from a frontal boundary. At this time, the chance for tropical development through the next 7 days is 40%.
 - No impacts to FEMA 6 from Kirk or Leslie. Ο
















Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities




Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities







Sunday's Weather







"Day 8-14" Hazards Outlook







