





FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing Saturday, November 02, 2024

Disclaimer: The purpose of this briefing is to provide a <u>**Regional**</u> weather threat assessment and is meant as a general overview. County/Parish decision makers should consult their local NWS forecast offices for the latest detailed, local weather information. To find your local NWS forecast office, go to <u>www.weather.gov/srh</u>.



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- Slight risk for severe storms Saturday over SE NM, WTX and SW OK and over OK into NW/N TX on Sunday. Threat shifts to E OK, W AR, N/Cntrl/ETX on Monday. Hail/damaging winds will be the main threats each day though isolated tornadoes will also be possible.
- Slight risk of excessive rainfall/flash flooding in OK, NWTX, WAR through Monday with a moderate risk of excessive rainfall/flash flooding over from central into northeast OK on Sunday.
- Two areas for tropical cyclone development in the southwestern and northeastern Caribbean Sea. No impacts are currently forecast for FEMA Region 6.



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

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




Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities



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


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Flood Watch over OK/NWTX through **Monday afternoon and** over SE NM, WTX through this morning.





Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities



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



"Day 8-14" Hazards Outlook







