FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Saturday, November 02, 2024

Disclaimer: The purpose of this briefing is to provide a <u>Regional</u> weather threat assessment and is meant as a general overview. County/Parish decision makers should consult their local NWS forecast offices for the latest detailed, local weather information.

- Slight risk for severe storms over OK into NW/NTX today. Slight to enhanced risk for severe storms over OK,WAR, N/NE/E/CntrlTX on Monday. Hail, damaging winds and a few tornadoes will be possible each day.
- Slight risk of excessive rainfall/flash flooding in OK, NWTX, WAR today and over EOK, WAR, NETX on Monday. Marginal risk for excessive rainfall Tuesday over EAR, NLA and SETX.
- Next storm system will begin to bring the chance of snow to the mountains of N NM Wed/Thu and marginal risk for heavy rainfall over OK and NTX on Thursday.
- AL 97 in the SW Caribbean has a high chance of development (80% in 48 hours). Significant impacts are not expected for FEMA 6 but will monitor LA late week.
- A system near the Greater Antilles has a low chance of development (10% in 7 days). No impacts to FEMA 6.





Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall




Minor river flooding over OK this morning.



Hatched Area: ≥ 10% probability of significant wind gusts (≥ 74 mph)



















Slight to enhanced risk for severe storms across E OK,W AR, eastern half of TX

Slight risk for excessive rainfall/flash flooding over E OK, NETX and W AR.




Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities









Marginal risk for excessive rainfall/flash flooding over EAR, SE TX, N LA









Green	Little to None Safety: Rarely a Direct Threat to Life and Property Impact Potential: Typically Results in Little Inconvenience to Daily Routines	Severe: Marginal Risk from SPC Flooding: Minor flooding expected over localized areas Tropical: None Fire Weather: No Watches/Warnings, fuel moisture above 10% or green up active	Thunderstorms expected over LA this afternoon; a few may produce winds to knock down a few trees Something that happens almost every day in a particular season such as seabreeze storms in coastal TX	
Yellow	Minor Safety: Rarely a Direct Threat to Life and Property Impact Potential: Typically Results in Some Inconvenience to Daily Life	Severe: Slight Risk from SPC Flooding: Nuisance flooded expected for a widespread area, or Minor flooding expected over isolated areas Tropical: A weak tropical wave expected to move towards or near any coastline Fire Weather: Red Flag Watches/Warnings and/or SPC outlines enhanced or critical fire outlook	 2-3 inches of rainfall expected over central AR today and tonight; some mino (brief) street flooding possible Scattered severe storms possible, one or two tornadoes expected, along with reports of strong winds/wind damage and ~1" hail
