There is a chance for thunderstorms today across the eastern Panhandles, mostly between the 9 AM to 3 PM but could continue until 9 PM. There is a very low chance that storms in the southeastern Texas Panhandle will be capable of producing 1" hail and 60 mph winds. If that were to happen, it'd be most favored in the 11 AM to 3 PM timeframe.




The severe weather threat today will be focused mainly off the Caprock. Severe storms are possible this morning and again late tonight, with the primary hazard being large hail.





A couple rounds of strong thunderstorms are expected in North Texas today through tonight which will be capable of gusty winds, hail, and heavy rainfall/flooding. Scattered showers and isolated storms are possible farther to the south.



The threat of strong to severe thunderstorms will return to the Four State Region on Monday afternoon through Monday night, mainly across the northwest half of the region. Stay tuned for more details as this forecast is further refined over the next few days!



Sunday. Mostly cloudy with scattered to thunderstorms over numerous showers and Southwest Southeast Texas and Louisiana, isolated showers over Central and South Central Louisiana. Highs in the lower 80s. Southeast winds 15 to 20 mph and gusty.




Rain and storm chances continue.



Today: Mostly Cloudy and Unseasonably Warm Austin/San Antonio, TX Isolated showers and thunderstorms




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
Continued isolated showers and thunderstorms along with unseasonably warm temperatures with highs ranging from the upper 70s to around 90. Breezy southerly winds with gusts up to 30 mph can be expected.



Large hail, damaging winds, and an isolated tornado are possible this afternoon and evening. Excessive rainfall is also possible with some of the heavier cells.



A round of thunderstorms is expected across the eastern Permian Basin this morning. A few of these thunderstorms could become severe with large hail, damaging winds, or an isolated tornado the main threats. Elsewhere, showers and thunderstorms are possible, but these should not become severe.



Sunday: A storm system will approach the borderland bringing a mix of everything such as, rain and snow to the mountains and afternoon rain showers to most lowland areas. The winds will be breezy to windy and from the west southwest. With a strong west southwesterly flow, there will be areas of patchy blowing dust near the International Border in the afternoon. The skies will be mostly cloudy with the high temperatures below the climatological normal.


