### Summary

- Marginal risk for severe storms over ETX, AR, LA today. Threats include damaging winds, tornadoes, and a marginal to slight risk for heavy rainfall.
- Next storm system will bring snow to N NM Wed/Thu and marginal to slight risk for heavy rainfall over OK and NTX on Thursday/Friday. System expands to AR/LA on Saturday.

### • **Tropical Weather:**

- TS Rafael in the Caribbean is expected to strengthen and move into the Gulf of Mexico by mid-week. Ο Monitoring for impacts to LA late week/weekend.
- A system near the southern Bahamas has a low chance of development (20% in 7 days). No impacts to Ο FEMA 6.





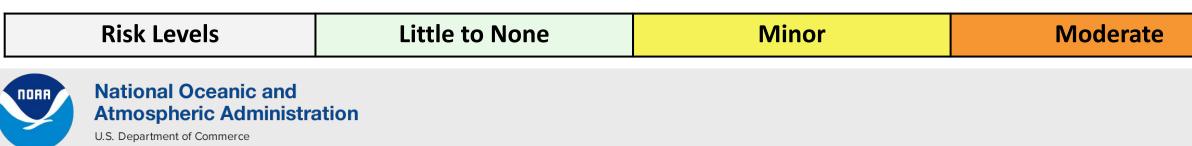




### Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities



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





### Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities


