
KEY MESSAGES

Stay up to date with forecast updates

Latest forecast trends suggest moisture and warm air may be even more plentiful with our upcoming storm system, playing a key role in where the rain-snow line situates itself. Any shifts in its position will move heavy snow potential further west Thu-Fri. or east Regardless, the best chances for snow still extend the reaches to far the of Panhandles, with heavy rain looking likely elsewhere.






