




Showers and thunderstorms return to the forecast today. Scattered showers and patchy drizzle could affect much of the area during the morning. By the afternoon, a few strong thunderstorms could develop west of I-35 which would have the potential to produce small hail. Highs will be in the upper 60s and lower 70s.



The Coastal Flood Advisory remains in effect through 6 PM Thursday. Up to 1' of inundation is possible, especially during times of high tide.



Scattered to numerous showers and primarily nonsevere thunderstorms will spread across South-Central Texas on Thursday. A few embedded stronger storms could develop with small hail. The greatest risk and window for an isolated severe thunderstorm occurs across Val Verde County from late tonight into early Friday morning. A Flood Watch is in effect for the Big Country and western Concho Valley from 6 PM Thursday through 3 PM Friday.






Severe Potential


Severe weather is possible across the Permian Basin and Lower Trans Pecos beginning this afternoon and continuing overnight. The main threat for severe weather is most likely late this evening. The main concerns with any severe thunderstorms will be large hail and damaging winds. An isolated tornado can not be ruled out as well. Be sure to have multiple ways to receive warnings this afternoon and before heading to bed tonight.



A Flood Watch is in effect beginning this evening and continuing through Friday morning for much of the eastern Permian Basin. Multiple rounds of slowmoving thunderstorms are likely to produce torrential rainfall with quick accumulations of several inches of rain possible for some. Areas that rainfall experience received recent or afternoon thunderstorms will be at increased risk for flash flooding tonight. If driving tonight, never drive through flooded roads! You can not determine the water depth, especially after dark!



Showers and thunderstorms producing heavy rainfall are expected to develop tonight and will likely persist well into Friday. Rainfall amounts of 2 to 4 inches may producing flooding mainly along and east of the I-27 corridor. A Flood Watch has been issued for this area and is valid from 6 PM today to 6 PM Friday.




A few severe thunderstorms are possible this afternoon through tonight, especially over southern portions of the South Plains and Rolling Plains. Hail up to quarter size is the primary hazard.






