- Moderate to high risk for excessive rainfall/flash flooding over far SETX into LA today
- Snow has ended over NM though moderate to major impacts will continue today.
- Minor river flooding over AR, NWTX, and W OK. Water getting close to homes in north AR.
- **Tropical Weather:**
 - Rafael is expected to move westward today in the central Gulf of Mexico then move south-southwestward and gradually weaken. No impacts to FEMA 6.
 - A system near the southern Bahamas has a low chance of development (10% in 7 days). No impacts to FEMA 6.










Tropical Weather Outlook – Atlantic/Gulf

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


Rafael








Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities



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
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Flood watch through tonight over SETX/LA


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Marginal risk of heavy rainfall over SETX and LA



Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities




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Marginal risk of heavy rainfall over SE LA





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

"Day 8-14" Hazards Outlook















Space Weather 3-Day Forecast
