- Marginal risk for severe storms today over the OK/TX Panhandles and far western OK. Severe threat shifts to E/SE LA on Wednesday.
- Marginal risk for excessive rainfall leading to flash flooding across EAR, SETX, LA on Wednesday.
- Minor to isolated moderate/major river flooding over AR and LA through the week.
- A tropical wave over the central Caribbean Sea has a high (80%) chance of tropical cyclone development as the system moves slowly westward. A tropical depression is likely to form by the end of the week. No impacts in the next 7 days.










Tropical Weather Outlook – Atlantic/Gulf





Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities





Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities





"Day 8-14" Hazards Outlook
















Space Weather 3-Day Forecast
