


COASTAL FLOOD ADVISORY IN EFFECT UNTIL 6 AM CST SATURDAY... * WHAT...Minor coastal flooding and elevated water levels. * WHERE...Gulf-facing Matagorda including the Peninsula, beaches. Brazoria County beaches, Galveston Island and the Peninsula. WHEN...Until Saturday. * IMPACTS...Flooding of lots, parks, and roads with only isolated road closures expected. * ADDITIONAL DETAILS...Water levels above 3.5 ft MLLW will result in minor coastal flooding at high tide. PRECAUTIONARY/PREPAREDNESS ACTIONS... If travel is required, allow extra time as some roads may be closed. Do not drive around barricades or through water of unknown depth. Take the necessary actions to protect flood-prone property.



Fire Danger Forecast




