





A cold front will bring widespread below freezing temperatures to the Panhandles on Wednesday morning! Light winds combined with these cooler temperatures will lead to wind chill temperatures around 5 to 10 degrees cooler than the air temperature. Be prepared for a cold start to Wednesday morning!




Breezy west winds of 25 to 35 mph with gusts up to 45 mph are expected this morning through the afternoon hours across the southern half of the South Plains and Rolling Plains. A Wind Advisory is in effect from 9 AM to 5 PM today.



The risk for severe thunderstorms will continue during the day on Monday, especially across central into southern Oklahoma. Damaging winds and a low tornado risk will continue with this activity.




Showers and thunderstorms will enter from the west shortly after midnight tonight, then push east through the region overnight through Monday morning along a Pacific cold front. A few storms may become severe with damaging winds the primary threat. A few tornadoes may also occur, and hail cannot be ruled out in a few storms. Activity will push east of the forecast area early Monday afternoon.



A line of thunderstorms will impact our western zones by early afternoon through the evening, continuing eastward into the overnight hours. Some of these storms may become strong or even severe, capable of producing strong damaging wind gusts and a few tornadoes as well.

Slight chance for severe thunderstorms (Level 2 out of 5)









Areas of showers and thunderstorms expected in the morning ahead of the cold front. Brief periods of heavy rainfall is possible, thus, proceed with caution during your commute. The front is expected to move across Southeast Texas during the afternoon hours with drier air pushing through behind it.



A cold front is moving through the area and is producing a line of thunderstorms. Some of these storms could become severe with damaging wind gusts as the primary hazard. An isolated tornado can not be ruled out. Stay weather aware! The front and line of storms will move east of the I-35 Corridor by 11 AM and should be out of South Central Texas by around 3 PM.





Fire Danger Forecast




Burn Ban

Keetch-Byram Drought Index


