- Slight to enhanced risk (levels 2-3 of 5) for severe storms over ETX, LA and SAR today.
- Slight to moderate risk (levels 2-3 out 4) for heavy rainfall/flash flooding over AR today.
- Elevated (level 1 of 3) fire weather conditions for S NM and WTX today.
- Monitoring for potential winter impacts over OK and AR Tue and Wed.
- Minor (level 2 of 4) river flooding will continue into next week in ETX, AR, LA.



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





Slight to moderate risk (levels 2-3 of 4) for excessive rainfall in AR.

Elevated (level 1 of 3) fire weather conditions in S NM and WTX.




Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities



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Today's Severe Thunderstorm Timing




Chances are highest for severe thunderstorm hazards between I PM and 10 PM CT today for FEMA Region 6.



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

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




Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities





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





"Day 3-7" Hazards Outlook



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

"Day 8-14" Hazards Outlook





