





# FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing Monday, February 17, 2025

**Disclaimer:** The purpose of this briefing is to provide a <u>**Regional**</u> weather threat assessment and is meant as a general overview. County/Parish decision makers should consult their local NWS forecast offices for the latest detailed, local weather information. 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- Summary
- Moderate winter impacts (level 2 of 4) over N OK and N AR Tue with 3-6" of snow possible. Further south, light freezing rain/drizzle may produce minor impacts (level 1 of 4) across cntrl/srn **OK/AR** into nrn TX/LA. Very cold across OK, AR, TX and LA with temperatures 25-35 degrees below normal Tue-Thu gradually moderating Friday and into Saturday.
- Marginal risk (level I of 5) for severe storms on Tuesday for SETX, S LA Tuesday.
- Marginal risk (level 1 of 4) for flash flooding in S LA Tuesday.
- Elevated (level I of 3) fire weather conditions S NM and WTX today and tomorrow.
- Minor (level 2 of 4) river flooding will continue into next week in ETX, AR, LA.

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





## Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities




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










## Tomorrow's Weather

Light freezing rain/freezing drizzle OK/AR into NTX and NLA




#### Scoldest Wind Chill
