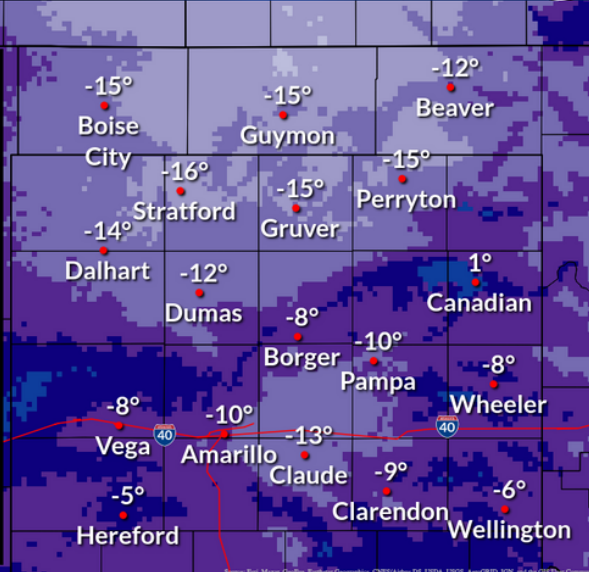

Hazardous cold morning/overnight temperatures are anticipated Tuesday night through Thursday morning. Wind chills as low as zero to -5 are expected for much of the Permian Basin. 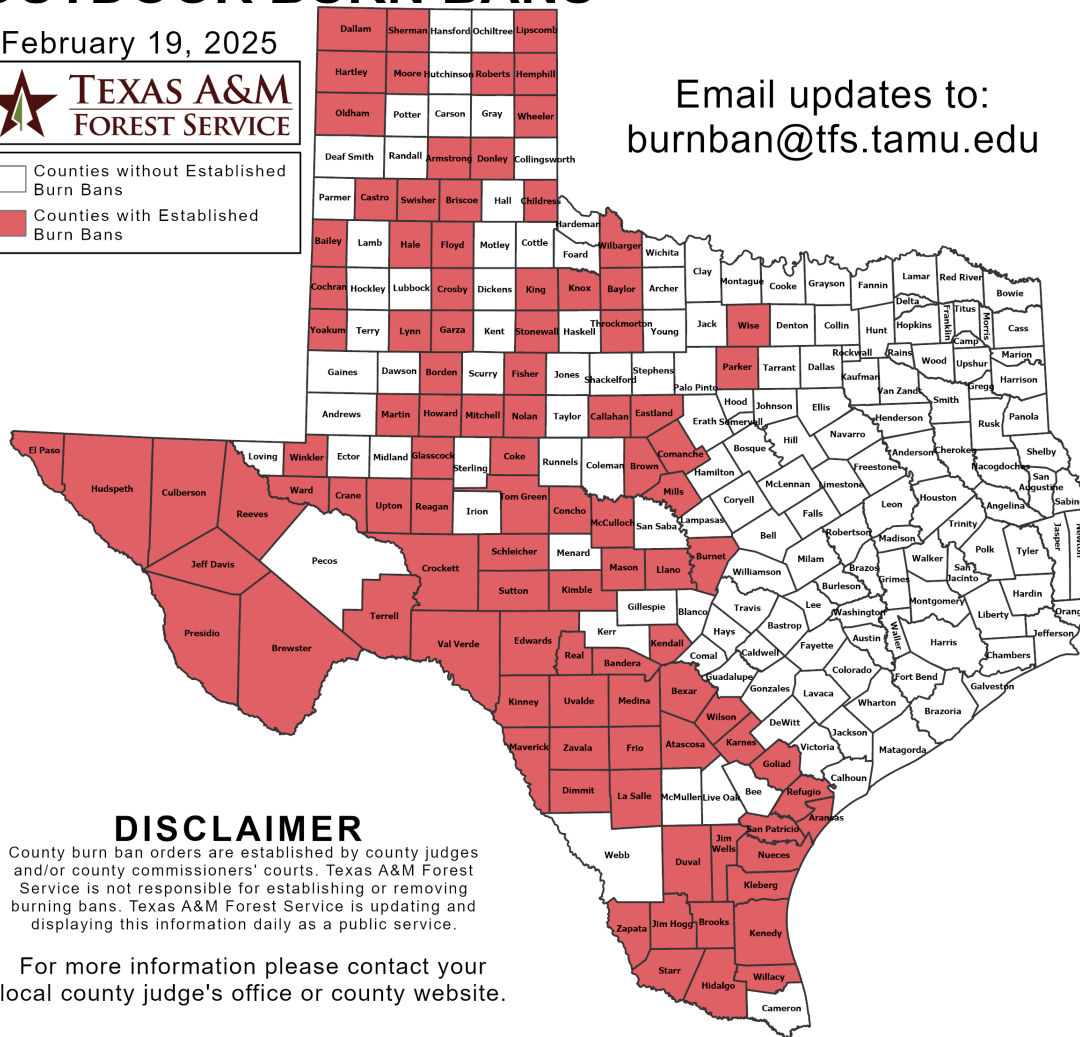

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

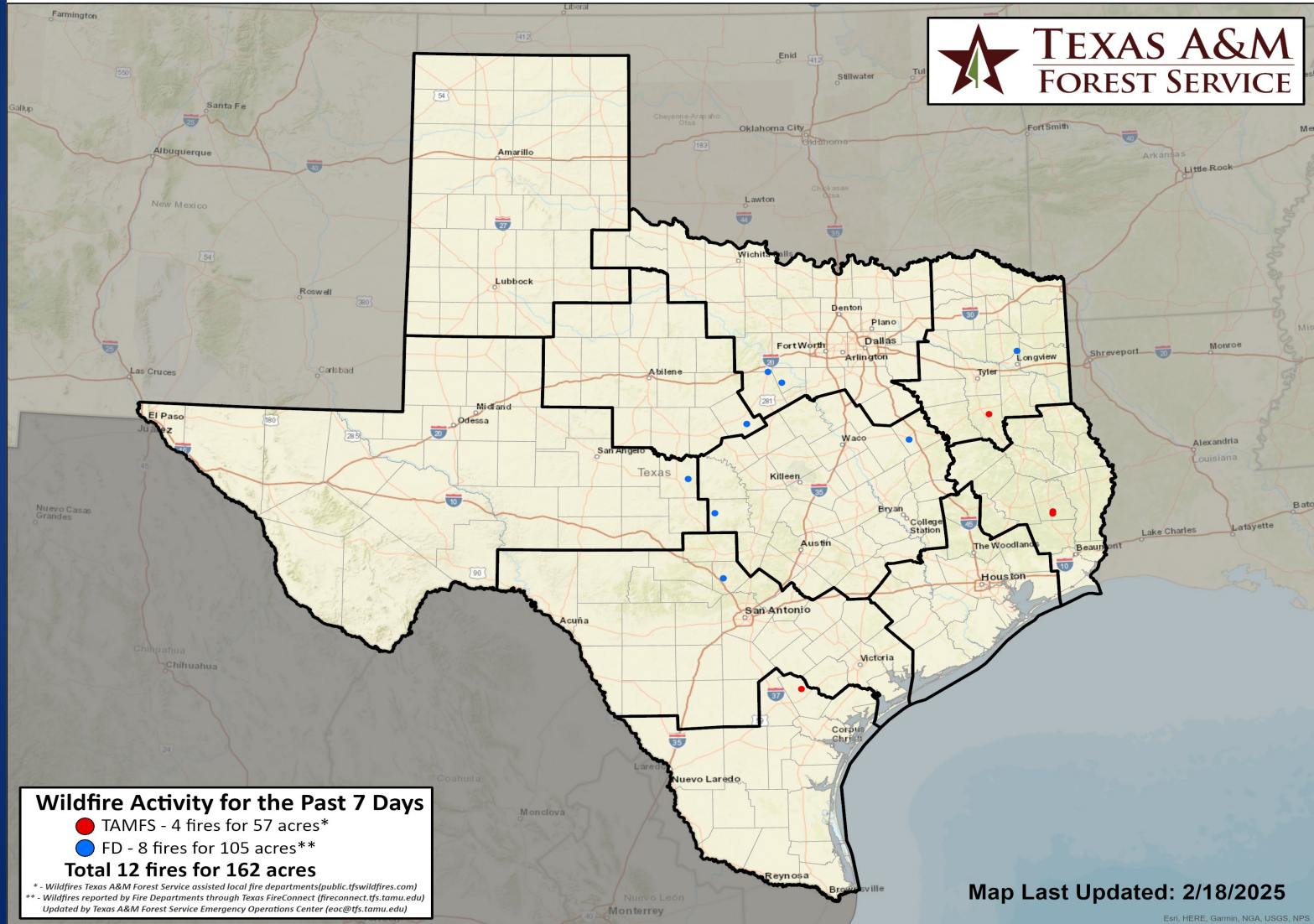
