STATEWIDE CURRENT SITUATION:

The State of Texas State Operations Center (SOC) has downgraded to Level III (Increased Readiness Conditions).

OPERATIONAL PRIORITIES:

- 1. Protect life and property.
- 2. Support rapid & effective response.
- 3. Collect and disseminate accurate incident information to improve decision-making.
- 4. Accurately track incident costs associated with assigned resources for cost recovery.

RESPONDING STATE AGENCIES/ORGANIZATIONS REPORTS STATE RESOURCES COMMITTED

Texas Division of Emergency Management, Texas A&M University System (TDEM):

Incident Support Task Force (ISTF): ISTF has submitted their final report, and with improving weather conditions, resources are scaling down. The American Red Cross has completed its sheltering mission and has closed two shelters.

Mass Care: As of February 22, there were 392 warming centers open, and four general population shelters open, with a total population of 138 people and four pets.

Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service (AgriLife): AgriLife has two SOC liaisons monitoring weather conditions, 26 Disaster Assessment and Recovery (DAR) specialists, and County Extension Stike Teams on standby. AgriLife Marketing and Communications has distributed preparedness information and educational resources to support county agents and specialists.

Public Utility Commission of Texas (PUC): Utilities continue normal operations and ERCOT's weather watch expired as of noon, February 21.

Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ): As of February 24, TCEQ is tracking eight drinking water systems that are on a Boil Water Notice (BWN) serving a population of 7,939. TCEQ has agency staff and emergency response hazmat contractors on heightened readiness for deployment to assist with any air/water/wasterelated issues, including drinking water/wastewater issues and/or emergency response activities.

Texas Department of Public Safety (TXDPS): On February 19, TXDPS Director Martin issued an emergency declaration for property-carrying vehicles.

Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT): As of 4:00 PM on February 23, there were no road closures due to the weather. TxDOT has returned to normal operations.

Texas Education Agency (TEA): As of February 21, severe weather impacted two school districts, Rising Star ISD and Woodson ISD.

Texas Military Department (TMD): TMD has released all personnel.

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD): TPWD has submitted their final report and continues to work closely with TDEM to ensure TPWD resources are available.

Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS): DSHS has released all personnel.

Texas Emergency Medical Task Force (EMTF): EMTF has released all personnel.

Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC): HHSC is monitoring the current weather conditions and impacts to state operated facilities.

Volunteer Organizations Active in Disasters (VOAD)

American Red Cross (ARC): The American Red Cross has completed their sheltering mission and support for this event.

Texans On Mission (TXM): Due to freezing temperatures, on February 18, TXM began assisting with meals for warming centers and shelters in the Dallas area. The final meal was prepared on February 21, and the site has since closed. TXM distributed a total of 10,800 meals.
