FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Monday, March 03, 2025

Disclaimer: The purpose of this briefing is to provide a <u>Regional</u> weather threat assessment and is meant as a general overview. County/Parish decision makers should consult their local NWS forecast offices for the latest detailed, local weather information.

- Critical to extreme (levels 2-3 of 3) fire weather conditions today through Tuesday for portions of NM, W/C TX, W OK. Significant fires more likely with a low to medium chance of wildfire outbreak. Elevated to critical (levels 1-2 of 3) conditions over SE NM and W TX Thu/Fri.
- Slight to enhanced risk (levels 2-3 of 5) of severe weather from late tonight through Tuesday across OK, NTX into AR and LA.A few tornadoes possible.
- Slight risk (level 2 of 4) for heavy rain leading to flash flooding in E OK, NETX, AR, N LA on Tuesday.
- Moderate risk (level 2 of 4) for winter impacts over NE NM tonight into Tuesday afternoon. Up to 3" of snow will combine with wind gusts to 70 mph to create near white-out conditions including I-25 through Raton Pass and US 87 through Capulin and Des Moines to Clayton.
- Minor (level 2 of 4) river flooding forecast through next week in ETX,AR, LA. Rain not expected to create significant river flooding, but may lead to new minor river rises.



5-Day Precipitation Forecast & River Flood Status






Minor river flooding will continue in ETX,AR, LA through the week with flooding of low-lying pastures, swampland, and secondary roads.

Elevated to critical (levels 1-2 of 3) fire weather conditions in NM,W TX,W OK,TX Panhandle.


Slight risk (level 2 of 5) for severe weather in NTX, OK. Timing severe threat: midnight into Tuesday.

Marginal risk (level 1 of 4) for heavy rainfall leading to flash flooding in OK, NTX.







Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities






Today's Severe Thunderstorm Timing





























Watches, Warnings, and Advisories

Winter storm watch late tonight into Tuesday afternoon across NE NM.

High Wind Warning in SE NM, W TX today until 9pm for gusts up to 65-70mph.

High Wind Watch in E NM, TX/OK Panhandle for Monday and Tuesday for gusts up to 60-65 mph and across S LA Tuesday for gusts of 40-50 mph.


Wind Advisory in S NM, WTX today until 7pm for gusts up to 50-55mph.

Winter Storm Severity Index



Slight risk (level 2 of 5) for severe storms in E OK, AR, ETX, and LA.


Elevated to critical (levels I-2 of 3) fire weather conditions in NM, W/C/NWTX,TX Panhandle,W OK.

Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities




