- Elevated to Critical (levels I-2 of 3) fire weather WTX, S/CTX today. Elevated fire weather (level I of 3) tomorrow for STX.
- Marginal risk (level 1 of 5) for severe weather in ETX, SW AR, and LA today.
- Minor to isolated moderate (levels 2-3 of 5) winter impacts from snow through this evening in the **TX/OK** panhandles. Minor (level 2 of 5) winter weather impacts in NM through this afternoon.
- Renewed fire weather concerns Tue/Wed next week NM/TX border, CTX, and the TX/OK panhandles.
- Monitoring for critical (level 2 of 3) fire weather concerns next Friday in WTX and the TX/OK panhandle.W OK possibly seeing critical (level 2 of 3) fire wx conditions next Friday.
- Minor (level 2 of 5) impacts in NM next Thursday due to snow.

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


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Minor river flooding will continue in ETX, AR, LA through the week with flooding of low-lying pastures, swampland, and secondary roads.

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



Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities



















Space Weather 3-Day Forecast
