Snow is already occurring in the northwest and timing has backed off a bit for the central and southeast as there is a bit more dry air above the surface that will take a little time to moisten up.



A Winter Weather Advisory has been issued until 9 PM for the northeastern South Plains and much of the far southern Panhandle for widespread snowfall amounts up to 1 inch and the potential for isolated amounts of 2 to 4 inches.

#### ) Key Message

- → Rain/Snow mix may change to snow at times.
- → Up to 3 inches of snow possible mainly in parts of western OK.
- → If a band develops, locally heavier amounts possible.
- → With warm ground and mostly above freezing temperatures, snow accumulations will be difficult.



#### **Timing**

→ Early Saturday morning through Saturday night.



#### **Impacts**


- → Minimal travel impacts due to snow. Maybe slushy spots, especially on elevated surfaces.
- → Reduced visibility during heavier snowfall







A rain/snow mix or all snow at times will be possible late tonight into early Sunday mainly across portions of western OK. There are several factors leading to uncertainty on how much snowfall but current forecast has a dusting up to 3 inches possible.



There is a Marginal Risk for severe thunderstorms on Saturday for all of East/Northeast Texas, North Louisiana and extreme South Arkansas, mainly for the threat of large hail. General timing for this threat appears to be late morning through afternoon and early evening hours.

#### Saturday: Hazardous Weather Outlook

#### What?

- Some scattered showers and embedded thunderstorms expected today in association with an upper level disturbance and cold front.
- Some thunderstorms could become severe across northeast parts of Southeast Texas.
- The better environment for this to occur would be in/around the dark green area which depicts a Marginal Risk of severe weather (level 1 out of 5).

#### When?

- A few rounds of storms are possible.
- One later this morning into early afternoon (~10am-2pm).
- The second, possible, round late in the afternoon to early evening along the front itself (~4pm-8pm).

- Primary: large hail and damaging winds.
- Secondary: Isolated tornado.





The forecast combination of breezy winds (gusts to 30 mph) and low humidity (10-20%) has led to the upgrade to a Red Flag Warning Saturday from noon to 8 PM . If hauling equipment, make sure your chains will not drag and cause sparks. Properly discard cigarettes and avoid open flames if possible.

#### **Critical Fire Weather Conditions**





- → A dry cold front arrives today with winds near 15 mph and locally higher gusts.
- Elevated to critical fire weather conditions are forecast as afternoon relative humidity falls into the teens and low 30s.
- → Conditions are favorable for rapid fire starts, but lighter winds may limit rapid fire spread.

A Red Flag Warning is in effect across the western 2/3rds of South-Central Texas this afternoon for critical fire weather conditions. Northwest winds of 15 to 25 mph sustained are expected with gusts up to 35 mph. Relative humidity will be as low as 10 to 20 percent and fuels are dry to critically dry across the region. Any fires that develop could be difficult to control and could spread rapidly. Avoid any outdoor activities that could inadvertently cause wildfires.

#### **Severe Thunderstorm Potential Overnight**





Isolated to scattered thunderstorms are possible overnight, mainly across the Big Country and Heartland. A few storms may be strong to severe, with large hail being the main hazard.




Large Hail (Quarter Size)





Strong to severe thunderstorms are possible overnight, mainly across the Heartland and Big Country. The main concerns will be large hail and dangerous lightning.



Breezy northwesterly winds and continued extremely dry conditions result in another day of dangerous fire weather today. The area of greatest concern includes Pecos, Jeff Davis, Presidio, Brewster, and Presidio counties, as well as the Davis Mountains Foothills. The Warning is in effect from 10 AM to 9 PM CST. Take precautions to avoid any fire starts as rapid growth and spread will be possible.







## **Keetch-Byram Drought Index**


