# FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Monday, March 10, 2025

**Disclaimer:** The purpose of this briefing is to provide a <u>Regional</u> weather threat assessment and is meant as a general overview. County/Parish decision makers should consult their local NWS forecast offices for the latest detailed, local weather information.

- Elevated to critical (levels I-2 of 3) fire weather concerns Tuesday-Saturday for portions of NM, W/C/STX,TX/OK Panhandle, and OK with extreme (level 3 of 3) conditions Friday.
- Slight to enhanced risk (levels 2-3 of 5) for severe storms on Friday for E OK, ETX, AR, and LA, with slight risk (level 2 of 5) Saturday in LA. Marginal risk (level 1 of 5) Wednesday across ETX, SE OK, SW AR, NW LA.
- Minor (level 2 of 5) impacts in NM Thursday and Friday due to snow. However, due to high winds, there may be periods of moderate impacts.
- Minor river flooding forecast through the week in ETX,AR, and LA.



Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall




Minor river flooding will continue in ETX, AR, LA through the week with flooding of low-lying pastures, swampland, and secondary roads.

Note: Numerical levels (e.g. level 1 of 4) will not be assigned to riverine flooding due to the varying levels of impacts across flood categories.








#### Tomorrow's Weather


#### Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities



Critical to extreme (levels 2-3 of 3) fire weather concerns for E NM, W/C/N TX, TX Panhandle, OK.


Minor impacts (level 2 of 5) from winter weather due to snow in NM.


Marginal risk (level 1 of 4) for heavy rainfall leading to flash flooding in EAR.


