





With the strong sustained winds and expected gusts upwards of 70 mph today, we can also expect medium to high chances for areas of dust to blow in from New Mexico as well. This dust could cause local to widespread reductions in visibility during the morning through afternoon hours.




Critical fire weather conditions will be found across the Panhandles today. West winds will gust from 60 to more than 75 mph at times. Lowest relative humidity values are expected to fall into the 10 to 15 percent range.




A High Wind Warning is in effect from 6 AM until 8 PM on Friday. Extremely strong winds of 40 to 50 mph with gusts to 80 mph are expected. Widespread blowing dust may result in significant visibility reductions.




Extremely critical fire weather conditions are expected Friday. A Red Flag Warning is in effect for the entire area. Rapid fire spread and extreme fire behavior are expected.




A strong storm system will approach and move across the Plains Friday. Several weather hazards will be possible Friday with this system including a large area of Critical to Extreme fire weather conditions, strong winds, and potentially reduce visibility due to blowing dust.



Very strong, potentially damaging winds are expected across most of our area on Friday. Sporadic power outages are possible, and unsecured items are likely to be blown over.



Extremely gusty west winds up to 65 mph and very low humidity will lead to dangerous fire weather conditions today. A dryline will move east of the I-35 corridor by the afternoon, with humidity dropping as low as 10% along with sustained winds between 20 to 40 mph. Frequent wind gusts above 50 mph and occasional gusts above 60 mph can be expected, which will lead to a high threat for grass fires and difficulty containing any existing fires. Do your part to prevent wildfires!



A High Wind Warning will be in effect for 7 AM this morning through the early evening as wind gusts approach 65 mph. Prepare for sporadic damage as well as difficult driving conditions. In addition to the High Wind Warning, a Wind Advisory is in effect elsewhere for sustained winds 20-30 mph and gusts up to 50 mph. Areas of blowing dust are expected as well with reduced visibilities.



There is a Marginal Risk for strong to severe thunderstorms across the southern half of Northeast Texas, much of Northern Louisiana and Southwest Arkansas. There is a Slight Risk for severe thunderstorms across far eastern Union County, Arkansas as well as easter Union and Ouachita Parishes in Northeast Louisiana. While an isolated strong to severe thunderstorm cannot be ruled out this afternoon into this evening, the greatest severe weather threat should be northeast and east of our region through tonight.




Very low humidity and strong southwest winds of 15-25 mph, with gusts up to 40 mph, can be expected today. This combination will lead to unusual and dangerous fire weather conditions, along with a Red Flag Warning across the western half of the forecast area. Avoid burning outside, be sure to secure tow chains, and don't drive over tall grass to prevent wildfires.

A few isolated to scattered thunderstorms will develop across the region today. There is a low risk for these storms to become severe.




A High Wind Warning and Wind Advisory are in effect from 7 AM to 7 PM today across all of west central Texas on Friday. Expect westerly winds from 30 to 45 mph and gusts to 60 mph for the Big Country, Concho Valley, and Heartland today. For the Wind Advisory over the Northern Edwards Plateau and Northwest Hill County, sustained westerly winds from 25 to 35 mph and gusts up to 55 mph are possible.



A significant high wind event will impact Southeast New Mexico and much of West Texas late tonight into Friday. High winds will start late tonight into early Friday morning in the Guadalupe, Delaware, and Davis Mountains and adjacent southeast New Mexico Plains, Culberson, and Reeves counties. High winds will develop over the Permian Basin by Friday morning and continue into Friday evening. A Wind Advisory will also be in effect for the Lower Trans Pecos and Big Bend region Friday morning through Friday evening. Wind gusts up to 75 mph are expected in the High Wind Warning area (even stronger up to around 90 mph in the higher terrain areas) with gusts up to 55 mph in the Wind Advisory area.



A Red Flag Warning is in effect from Noon CDT/11 AM MDT Friday afternoon through 9 PM CDT/8 PM MDT Friday evening for West Texas and Southeast New Mexico. Please take the necessary precautions to avoid igniting any sparks.



High Winds today will cause blowing dust across West Texas and Southeast New Mexico. As a result, a Blowing Dust Advisory is in effect until 8pm MDT/9pm CDT tonight. Visibilities could drop as low as 1/4 to 1 mile at times, so if you must be out today drive slowly and use low beam headlights!






