FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Wednesday, March 19, 2025

- Elevated to Critical (levels I-2 of 3) fire weather concerns continue through the week for much of NM, OK, and TX. Red flag warning in effect through this evening for much of AR.
- Slight risk (level 2 of 5) for severe weather Sunday for SAR, ETX, and NLA. Mainly a hail threat. Marginal risk (level 1 of 4) for heavy rainfall on Sunday for SEAR, LA, and SETX.
- Isolated minor river flooding in ETX, SE LA through the next 7 days.



Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall




Isolated minor river flooding in across ETX, SE LA through the next 7 days.

Note: Numerical levels (e.g. level 1 of 4) will not be assigned to riverine flooding due to the varying levels of impacts across flood categories.







Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities







Watches, Warnings, and Advisories

Gusts between 55-65 mph may lead to blowing dust.















Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities







Elevated to Critical (levels I-2 of 3) fire weather conditions in SE NM, W/N TX, TX/OK Panhandles, W OK.








