# Prepared by Melissa Beat



- Elevated to critical (levels I-2 of 3) fire weather concerns today across portions of TX, OK, and AR with conditions continuing into Saturday for NM, OK, and TX. Elevated conditions possible through mid week.
- Slight risk (level 2 of 5) for severe weather Sunday for SAR, NETX, and NLA. Main threats are hail and wind, but isolated tornado possible. Timing: afternoon through late evening.
- Marginal risk (level I of 4) for heavy rainfall on Sunday for SEAR, ETX, N LA and then in SE LA on Monday.
- Isolated minor river flooding in ETX and SE LA continues.



Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall





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


# Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities

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
