FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Monday, March 24, 2025

Disclaimer: The purpose of this briefing is to provide a <u>Regional</u> weather threat assessment and is meant as a general overview. County/Parish decision makers should consult their local NWS forecast offices for the latest detailed, local weather information.

- Marginal risk (level 1 of 5) of severe storms for S/SE LA through late afternoon.
- Slight risk (level 2 of 5) of severe storms over E OK and AR on Saturday and over E OK, AR, LA and ETX on Sunday.
- Elevated (level I of 3) fire weather conditions in NWTX, N OK today.
- A system mid to late week brings risk for heavy rainfall to TX and SW LA.
- Isolated minor river flooding in ETX continues to recede and SE LA looks to end late today.



Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall




Isolated minor river flooding in across ETX continues, while SE LA ends late today.


Elevated (level 1 of 3) fire weather concerns in NWTX,W OK.

Within 25 miles of a point.




Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities

















Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities













Marginal risk (level 1 of 4) of heavy rainfall over SETX and SW LA





Drought Monitor




