FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Friday, March 28, 2025

Disclaimer: The purpose of this briefing is to provide a <u>Regional</u> weather threat assessment and is meant as a general overview. County/Parish decision makers should consult their local NWS forecast offices for the latest detailed, local weather information.

- Slight risk (level 2 of 4) of heavy rainfall/flash over SETX and S LA today.
- Enhanced risk (level 3 of 5) of severe storms over E OK, AR, LA, ETX on Sunday and LA on Monday.
- Elevated (level I of 3) fire weather threat due to gusty winds and low relative humidity over NM, WTX today. Elevated to critical (levels I-2 of 3) fire wx conditions over NM, WTX and the TX Panhandle on Saturday returning to elevated over NM, WTX on Sunday.
- Minor with isolated moderate river flooding over S and SETX with mainly impacts to lowland areas and secondary roads.



Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall




Minor to isolated moderate river flooding will develop today over S into SETX with mainly impacts to lowland areas and secondary roads.



Elevated (level 1 of 3) fire weather threat over NM and WTX.




Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities














Flood watch over STX through Friday morning; and over mid-TX coast through Friday evening.




Elevated to critical (levels I-2 of 3) fire weather threat over NM and WTX and the TX Panhandle.

Enhanced Risk (level 3 of 5) over AR and N LA


Slight risk (level 2 of 5) of severe storms over E OK, ETX and LA.

Elevated (level 1 of 3) fire weather threat over NM and WTX.




