- Severe Storms: Today is worst day with High risk (level 5 of 5) for Far NE AR. Saturday has Enhanced risk (level 3 of 5) SEAR, N LA. Thur/Fri all have Slight risk (level 2 of 5). High chance of tornado outbreak today with multiple long-track EF3+ tornadoes.
- Flooding: Thursday is worst day with High risk (level 4 of 4) for Far NE AR. Today/Fri/Sat have Moderate risk (level 3 of 4) for AR and SE OK, NETX. Sun has Slight risk (level 2 of 4).
- Widespread minor to moderate flooding with isolated major river flooding through the weekend over AR, N/ETX, LA.



Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall









Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities




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
Today's Tornado Timing



Tornado Timing: OK, NTX 3 PM through 11 PM.


Strong tornado most likely in the evening hours in central/N OK. Timing of severe wind and hail will be similar.













Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities










