# FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Wednesday, April 16, 2025

**Disclaimer:** The purpose of this briefing is to provide a <u>Regional</u> weather threat assessment and is meant as a general overview. County/Parish decision makers should consult their local NWS forecast offices for the latest detailed, local weather information.

- Fire Weather: Elevated to critical (levels I-2 of 3) over NM and WTX today; critical to extremely critical (levels 2-3 of 3) Thursday over NM,TX/OK Panhandles and WTX; elevated to critical (levels I-2 of 3) over NM and WTX on Friday.
- Severe Weather: Marginal risk (level I of 5) for severe storms over NW/N OK today. Slight risk (level 2 of 5) for severe storms Friday in NW/NTX, OK, NW AR; from SW-NETX, SE OK, NW LA and AR on Saturday; then over ETX, AR and LA on Sunday.
- Flash Flooding: Slight risk (level 2 of 4) for flash flooding over C/NE OK Friday; N/NW TX, OK and NW AR on Saturday.
- Widespread moderate to major river flooding over AR through the next 7 days with isolated major flooding in SE LA by Tuesday, April 22. Widespread minor to isolated moderate river flooding over ETX and LA. Gradual improvement for most of AR through the week.



#### 5-Day Precipitation Forecast & River Flood Status


Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall



- Widespread moderate to major river flooding in AR where numerous homes and roads/highways will be flooded.
- Isolated Major Flooding in SE LA by next Tuesday, April 22. Baton Rouge and the main LSU campus are protected by levees at this forecast level.
- Widespread minor with isolated moderate river flooding over ETX and LA. Impacts mainly to secondary roads and agricultural areas.




Elevated to critical (levels I-2 of 3) fire weather conditions in NM,W TX,TX/OK Panhandles.

Marginal risk (level 1 of 5) of severe storms over NW/N OK.





#### Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities









#### Wind, Severe, Heat, and Flood Hazards










Red Flag Warnings today and tomorrow over NM and far W TX

Fire Weather Watch W OK, Panhandles and W TX on Thursday.




#### Tomorrow's Weather


#### Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities


Slight (level 2 of 5) risk of severe storms in N/NWTX, OK, NW AR.

### Saturday's Weather



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
Within 25 miles of a point.

Slight risk (level 2 of 5) for flash flooding over OK, N/NW TX, and NW AR




