FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Friday, April 18, 2025

Disclaimer: The purpose of this briefing is to provide a <u>Regional</u> weather threat assessment and is meant as a general overview. County/Parish decision makers should consult their local NWS forecast offices for the latest detailed, local weather information.

- Severe Weather: Slight risk (level 2 of 5) for severe storms today in NW/NTX, OK, NW AR; from SW-NTX, SE OK, and NW AR tomorrow; then over SE OK, ETX, AR, NW LA on Sunday.
- Flash Flooding: Slight risk (level 2 of 4) over C/NE OK, NW AR today; with a slight to moderate risk (levels 2-3 of 4) over E OK, NW AR and NTX tomorrow; Marginal (level I of 4) risk for NE OK, AR, and N LA Sunday; Marginal (level I of 4) risk on Tuesday for C OK, N/C TX.
- Fire Weather: Elevated to critical (levels I-2 of 3) over SE NM and WTX today and elevated (level I of 3) over WTX on Sunday.
- Minor (level 2 of 5) impacts in N NM starting this afternoon through tomorrow night from high elevation snow.
- Widespread moderate to isolated major river flooding over AR through the next 7 days with isolated major flooding in SE LA by Thursday, April 24.



5-Day Precipitation Forecast & River Flood Status

Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall



Note: Numerical levels (e.g. level 1 of 4) will not be assigned to riverine flooding due to the varying levels of impacts across flood categories.

- Widespread moderate to isolated major river flooding over AR through the next 7 days numerous homes and roads/highways will be flooded.
- Isolated Major Flooding in SE LA by next Thursday, April 24. Baton Rouge and the main LSU campus are protected by levees at this forecast level.
- Minor river flooding over E TX and LA. Impacts mainly to secondary roads and agricultural areas.



Flood Watch over NE OK, NW AR 7 PM Today through 7 PM Sunday.














Slight risk (level 2 of 5) for severe storms over SW-NTX, SE OK, AR.


Minor (level 2 of 5) impacts in N NM tomorrow from high elevation snow.

Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities












