





FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Saturday, April 26, 2025

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Summary

- <u>Severe Weather</u>: Today, Marginal risk (level 1 of 5) for E NM, TX Panhandle, NW TX, S OK, N TX, SW AR and NW LA. Sunday, Marginal risk (level 1 of 5) for E NM, WTX, TX/OK Panhandles, W OK. Monday, Slight risk (level 2 of 5) for OK, NW TX. Tuesday, Slight risk (level 2 of 5) for N/NW TX, E OK, NW AR. Wednesday, Slight risk (level 2 of 5) over NTX and SE OK.
- Flash Flooding: Today, Slight risk (level 2 of 4) for S OK, N/NW TX. Tuesday, Marginal risk (level 1 of 4) over E OK, N/C TX, NW AR. Wednesday, Slight risk (level 2 of 4) for E/S OK, N TX.
- Fire Weather: Elevated to Critical (levels I-2 of 3) fire weather concerns today for W NM. Critical to extremely critical (levels 2-3 of 3) fire weather concerns expand into WTX tomorrow.
- <u>River Flooding</u>: Moderate river flooding over AR persists the next 7 days with isolated major flooding in SE LA, cresting late next week.







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
Elevated to Critical (levels 1-2 of 3) fire weather concerns for W NM.

Marginal risk (level 1 of 5) for severe storms in E NM, TX Panhandle, NW/N TX, S OK, SW AR and NW LA.




Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities




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Fire Weather Outlooks



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
Red Flag Warning S NM/WTX late morning to late evening Sunday.







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

"Day 3-7" Hazards Outlook



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

"Day 8-14" Hazards Outlook





