# FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Sunday, April 27, 2025

**Disclaimer:** The purpose of this briefing is to provide a <u>Regional</u> weather threat assessment and is meant as a general overview. County/Parish decision makers should consult their local NWS forecast offices for the latest detailed, local weather information.

- <u>Severe Weather</u>: Today, slight risk (level 2 of 5) over WTX and the TX/OK Panhandles with very large hail and damaging winds the main threats. Monday, slight risk (level 2 of 5) over OK and NW TX with very large hail and damaging winds the main threats. Tuesday, slight risk (level 2 of 5) over N/NW TX, E OK, NW AR. Wednesday, slight risk (level 2 of 5) over NTX.
- Flash Flooding: Monday, marginal risk (level 1 of 4) over OK and NWTX. Tuesday, slight risk (level 2 of 4) over OK, NWTX, NW and Wednesday, slight risk (level 2 of 4) over E/S OK, N/NETX and WAR.
- <u>Fire Weather</u>: Today, critical to extremely critical (levels 2-3 of 3) fire weather threat across NM and WTX with an elevated threat (level 1 of 3) over NM and far WTX Mon/Tue.
- River Flooding: Moderate river flooding over AR persists the next 7 days with isolated major flooding in SE LA, cresting late next week. Isolated moderate to major river flooding in SW OK through Tuesday.



Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall




- Moderate river flooding over AR through the next 7 days.
   Homes and roads/highways will be flooded.
- Isolated Major Flooding in SE LA crests Thursday, May Ist. Baton Rouge and the main LSU campus are protected by levees at this forecast level.
- Isolated moderate to major river flooding through Tuesday over SW OK will impact croplands and secondary roads.




#### Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities











Red Flag Warning NM/W

with blowing dust.






Slight risk (level 2 of 5) for severe storms in OK and NW TX with hail/damaging winds the main threats.

Marginal risk for flash flooding (level I of 4) over OK and NW TX.




#### Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities






