





# FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

# Monday, April 28, 2025

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## Summary

- <u>Severe Weather</u>: Today, slight risk (level 2 of 5) over OK and NWTX with very large hail and damaging winds the main threats. Tuesday, slight risk (level 2 of 5) over NW/WTX, E OK, NW AR. Wednesday, slight risk (level 2 of 5) over NTX. Thursday, marginal risk (level 1 of 5) EAR, NE LA and Friday over SWTX.
- Flash Flooding: Today, marginal risk (level I of 4) over OK and from NW-SWTX. Tuesday, slight to moderate risk (levels 2-3 of 4) over OK, NW AR and NW TX. Wednesday, slight to moderate risk (levels 2-3 of 4) over OK, AR, N/NETX. Thursday, marginal risk (level 1 of 4) EAR, NE LA and Friday over SWTX.
- Fire Weather: Today, elevated to critical threat (levels 1-2 of 3) over NM and far WTX with an elevated threat (level 1 of 3) over these areas Tue/Wed.
- <u>River Flooding</u>: Moderate river flooding over AR persists through the week with isolated major flooding in SE LA, cresting late this week. Moderate to major river flooding in SW OK through late week.



Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall





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

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

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

# Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities



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




