FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Tuesday, April 29, 2025

Disclaimer: The purpose of this briefing is to provide a <u>Regional</u> weather threat assessment and is meant as a general overview. County/Parish decision makers should consult their local NWS forecast offices for the latest detailed, local weather information.

- <u>Severe Weather</u>: Today, slight to enhanced risk (levels 2-3 of 5) over OK, NAR, and NW/WTX. Tomorrow, slight risk (level 2 of 5) over SE OK, WAR, and NTX. Thursday, marginal risk (level 1 of 5) SE OK, AR, C/ETX, N LA.
- Flash Flooding: Today, slight to moderate risk (levels 2-3 of 4) over OK, NW AR and NW TX. Tomorrow, slight to moderate risk (levels 2-3 of 4) over E OK, AR, N/NE TX, NW LA. Thursday, marginal risk (level I of 4) E AR, NE LA and Friday SE NM, TX, N LA. Marginal risk (level I of 4) for heavy rain continues in SE NM, SW TX Saturday.
- <u>Fire Weather</u>: Today/tomorrow, elevated to critical threat (levels I-2 of 3) over NM and far W TX. Elevated (level I of 3) fire weather concerns for SW NM Friday/Saturday.
- River Flooding: Moderate river flooding over AR persists through the week with isolated major flooding in SE LA, through May 7th. Moderate to major river flooding in SW OK, through mid week with minor to moderate over N and ETX.



Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall




- Moderate river flooding over AR through Thursday. Homes and roads/highways will be flooded.

- Moderate to major river flooding through through Wednesday over SW OK will impact croplands and secondary roads.



Slight to moderate risk (levels 2-3 of 4) for flash flooding in OK, NW AR, NW TX.


Enhanced risk (level 3 of 5) for severe storms in S OK, N TX. Main risk hail greater than 2" in diameter.

Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities






Severe thunderstorm watch across OK, NW AR through 10 AM CDT.






Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities






