- <u>Severe Weather</u>: Today, slight risk (level 2 of 5) for S OK, S AR, N/NE TX, N LA. Tomorrow, Slight risk (level 2 of 5) risk for CTX. Marginal (level 1 of 5) risk for severe storms in far STX Saturday.
- Flash Flooding: Today slight Risk (level 2 of 4) for Flash Flooding in SOK, NTX, WAR. Tomorrow, slight risk (level 2 of 4) for SE OK, SW AR, S/C TX, NW LA. Monitoring for flash flooding potential across portions of E NM/TX/OK Sunday-Wednesday of next week. Heavy rainfall may extend into next Thursday across portions of S/ETX.
- Fire Weather: Elevated (level 1 of 3) fire weather concerns for SW NM Saturday, with locally critical (level 2 of 3) fire weather concerns Sunday afternoon in SW NM.
- <u>River Flooding</u>: Moderate to isolated Major flooding across OK and NTX through Saturday afternoon/evening. Through May 7th, isolated major flooding in SE LA.



Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall







Slight Risk (level 2 of 4) for Flash Flooding in S OK, N TX, W AR.




Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities











Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities












